



Notes.

Some of the subclasses of Edward pennies are difficult to differentiate, especially if the coin is worn or damaged. Additionally some coins can be transitional, displaying characteristics of different types. This sheet uses some obvious characteristics to differentiate types but does not cover all the subtle differences. There are a number of different reference books which cover coins of this period, and they do not always agree as to which characteristics differentiate the classes. References are given from English Hammered Coinage by J.J.North
